COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE COUNCIL MEETING, OCTOBER 12, 2021

GRANT REQUEST – WOODS HARBOUR BALLFIELD SOCIETY

It is recommended that the Woods Harbour Ballfield Society be provided with a grant in the amount of \$500.00.

RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

Current appointments to the Recreation Advisory Committee expire the end of October, 2021.

It is recommended that Nicole Nickerson – District 2, Charla Strang - District 3 and Jonathan Langille – District 4 be appointed to serve on the Recreation Advisory Committee for another two year term commencing November 1, 2021.

Three vacancies still exist on the Committee for districts 1, 5 and for the Town of Clarks Harbour.

MEDICAL CLINIC

It is recommended that the construction of a Medical Clinic be identified as a priority of the Municipality and budgeting for such a facility commence in 2022 and it be included in our Strategic Plan.

SET MEETING DATES FOR DECEMBER, 2021

Due to the Christmas season it is recommended that the regular dates of Council and Committee meetings be changed for the month of December, 2021.

It is recommended that a Committee of the Whole Council meeting be held on December 6th and a Council meeting be held on December 13th.

STUDENT SPONSORSHIP

It is recommended that the Municipality participate in the Shelburne County Student Sponsorship Program by contributing \$1,500.00 per year for the next 5 years commencing in January, 2022.

ST. MATTHEW'S UNITED CHURCH, CLYDE RIVER

It is recommended that a letter be provided to the Clyde River Society and Cemetery in support of their proposal to the United Church of Canada and acknowledging the importance of their efforts to restore the Church which will become a non-denominational Church that can be used by the community, as well as a location to offer various other services.
